USDA - Rural Broadband Loans

The USDA announced that it will make available 2.2 billion for loans and loan guarantees for providers to deploy broadband internet services to underserved communities.

USDA defines underserved as communities "not contained in an incorporated city or town with a population in excess of 20,000."

In 2003, USDA provided 1.4 billion in loans and guarantees through this program. This program is administered by the departments Rural Utilities Service.
